

## LATINO REGISTRATION AND VOTING IN TEXAS (2002 – 2022)


- ➡ In 2020, there were 3.5 million Latino registered voters in Texas up from 2.8 million in 2018. This represents an increase of 700,000 new Latino registered voters (U.S. Census Bureau, Current Population Survey, Voting and Registration Series).
- ⇒ WCVI estimates Latino voter registration will be approximately 3.7 million by the 2022 midterm election cycle.



Turnout of Latino registered voters has averaged 55.1% in Texas midterm elections since 2002 (lower than the national average of 64.6% for Latino registered voters).

- → WCVI estimates Latino
  Turnout will reach 2.9
  million votes cast in the
  November 2022 midterm
  election (compared to 1.9
  million in the November
  2018 midterm election).
- → WCVI estimates Latino voters will comprise of 26.5% of all votes cast in the November 2022 midterm election (compared to 21.6% in the November 2018 midterm election).





Latinos in Texas have typically underperformed Latinos nationwide in terms of turnout rates; this trend is expected to hold during the November 2022 midterm cycle.

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
